









Objectives








In today's dynamic digital landscape, too fast evolution of technology introduces an ever-growing urgency to upgrade the capacities of formal and non-formal educators navigating online. Recent studies reveal that over 90% of youth workers, educators, content creators, and bloggers acknowledge encountering new and diverse challenges in media literacy and cyber security annually (Triplett, W. J. (2023). Addressing Cyber security Challenges in Education. International Journal of STEM Education for Sustainability, https://doi.org/10.52889/ijses.v3i1.132). The investigation of the main keywords associated with digital skills, as highlighted by Tinmaz et al.'s systematic review on digital literacy, emphasizes the significance of information literacy, ICT, communication, collaboration, digital content creation, research, and decision-making skills as the most representative in of digital competencies (Tinmaz et al., https://doi.org/10.1186/s40561-022-00204-y). Notably, dangers transcend conventional social media platforms such as Facebook, Instagram, and TikTok; emerging threats also lurk in less scrutinized platforms like Snapchat, highlighting the need for a comprehensive approach. It should be mentioned that dangers aren't confined to the usual suspects of well-known social media platforms like Facebook, Instagram, and TikTok; lesser- explored platforms such as Snapchat, Twitter, and Reddit also contain emerging threats. This emphasizes the necessity for a thorough and holistic approach to address nonstop changing online risks. Recognizing the mentioned needs the "SecureScreen: Media Literacy and Cyber security for Participation" project is strategically addressing these challenges. The project is planned to empower the potential stakeholders, with a specific focus on fact-checking, and combating the threats of online manipulations, hate speech, and bullying.






ACCESS / PUBLIC TRANSPORT IN LUXEMBOURG



If you arrive by plane, take the bus 29 (direction Gasperich, Guillaume Kroll) to the bus stop "Luxembourg, Gare Centrale routière". From Luxemburg Central Station you should take train to Esch/Alzette Gare. As the youth hostel is situated directly next to the Esch/Alzette bus and train station, it is comfortably accessible by public transportation. The train connection from the capital to Esch takes a 24 minutes! 




VENUE: ESCH-SUR-ALZETTE CITY, LUXEMBOURG



Esch-sur-Alzette is the heart of Southern Luxembourg, the so-called Minette region. Long before the Grand Duchy became a global player in the financial sector and the European Union institutions were established, the region was known throughout Europe for iron ore exploitation and processing. While the Minette's industrial heritage remains omnipresent, Esch and its modern Belval district have become popular for students and concertgoers. 
- 2. E-ticket or/and receipt/invoice from flights;
