GENC GIRISIM also conducts various trainings and seminars and promotes sports among seniors through its involvement in Erasmus+KA2 projects.





General Information Tasks of the volunteers

The volunteer will work 7 hours per day, 5 days per week. Saturdays and Sundays are free. Working Hours: 09:00-17:00. Holidays: The volunteer will have two consecutive days off per week and will also have two days of holiday per month for the whole duration of the ESC project. Sometimes the volunteer will give a hand on projects at week-ends. In this case, the volunteer will have compulsory days off. The volunteer will follow the scheduled program, which is prepared by the Genç Girişim management team.



Objectives:

This project aims to immerse volunteers in the entire lifecycle of a summer school, from initial planning to successful implementation. You'll gain firsthand experience as part of a dynamic

team, collectively shaping an inclusive, and impactful summer school that promises both fun and enriching educational experiences for all participants.

Volunteers will be involved in the following activities:

Our volunteers are crucial to the success of the summer school, and their main functions include the following:

- To propose various educational, entertaining, cultural, and recreational activities.
- To brainstorm and develop ideas for activities and workshops, then to prepare and carry them out effectively.
- To create a detailed summer school schedule that ensures both time efficiency and a rich variety of engaging activities.
- To handle the full preparation of activities, including identifying and listing necessary materials, and arranging supporting services (e.g., group movements, meal times).

Language Support and Mentor

Turkish Language Lessons are the compulsory part of the weekly schedule. The language course will be adjusted according to the volunteers needs.

The volunteers will receive language support 2-4 hrs per week in order to facilitate their communication with locals and to 'survive' for their daily necessities.

We will provide mentorship to the volunteers. Our mentor is experienced in Erasmus+ programme and is a local citizen which will support the adaption process of the volunteer in the hosting community.

Non-formal and informal education

Moreover, the volunteer will join the projects, which are implemented by experts and international and Turkish volunteers. Any contribution to improve the project is requested and welcomed. According to their interest, the ESC volunteers will have the possibility to join other projects, which are national or international and hosted by Genç Girişim. Thus, volunteers can spend their free times in effective and enjoyable way.



Venue

The venue for ESC service: Ankara – is the capital of Turkey and the country's second largest city. Located in Central Anatolia, Ankara is an important commercial and industrial city. It is the center of the Turkish Government, and houses all foreign embassies. It is an important crossroads of trade, strategically located at the center of Turkey's highway and railway networks, and serves as the marketing center for the surrounding agricultural area. The population of Ankara – more than 5,5 mln.


Ankara has a hot-summer continental climate. Due to its elevation and inland location, Ankara has cool, snowy winters and hot, dry summers.

Rainfall occurs mostly during the spring and autumn.

The Electricity, Gas, Bus General Directorate (EGO) operates the Ankara Metro and other forms of public transportation. Ankara is currently served by a suburban rail named Ankaray and three subway lines of the Ankara Metro.

Phone Sim Card

The volunteer can get a Turkish Sim Card of the brand Türk Telekom by paying 650 TL in the first month and then s/he can use it for 3 months without having problems. The monthly fee is 250-400 TL



The Ankara Central Station is a major rail hub in Turkey. The Turkish State Railways operates passenger train service from Ankara to other major cities such as: İstanbul, Eskişehir, Balıkesir, Kütahya, İzmir, Kayseri, Adana, Kars, Elâzığ, Malatya, Diyarbakır, Karabük, Zonguldak, Sivas, Sincan and Kayaş, Konya. Ankara Intercity Bus Terminal (AŞTİ) is an important part of the bus network which covers every neighbourhood in the city. Esenboğa International Airport, located in the north-east of the city, is Ankara's main airport.

Office of Genç Girişim located in the central part of the city named Çankaya.

Travel- How to reach the center of Ankara from Esenboga Airport?

When you exit the airport, on your right you will see shuttle bus stop

HAVAŞ or Nr: 442 red colour Ankara Municipality Buses.

The ticket for HAVAŞ bus is about 130-150 TL ($^{\sim}4EUR$) and 442 NR. Bus 80 TL they depart from the airport every 30 min.

The travel from airport to city center takes around 40-45 min.

You should go to the city center - the stop named: AŞTİ. From there we will pick you up! Please call us when you are in AŞTİ bus!

Accomodation



Volunteers will be accommodate in an apartment close to the center of Ankara.

The location offers safety and security for volunteers and makes it easy to any kind of transportation. The apartment due to its location it makes it easy to reach at any hour during the day and night.

The participants will be hosted in a shared apartment in seperated or shared rooms. Taking care of the place of accommodation is also part of volunteers' responsibilities and will share the common space such as: living room, kitchen and bathrooms.

Free Internet connection will be provided for them(WiFi).

To save this House we have few simple rules for inmates:

- using all equipment and furniture carefully and keep in good condition;
- to keep home clean;
- in case of any technical problems in house to connect with ESC Coordinator.



















Local Transport



There are many options of transport such as: Metro, public buses, minibuses (dolmus) and taxi (which is affordable in case you use for short distances in case of any emergency).

Visa & Insurance

VISA: We start the visa process for long-term volunteers when they arrive in Turkey. Volunteers who come from some non-EU countries for short or long-term ESC projects must obtain a visa before their arrival in Turkey. Please check the visa requirements.

HENNER: The health Insurance covers the volunteers since the project starting date until two months after project finishing date.

Financial Conditions



The volunteer will receive:

Food Money and Local Transport – Payments will be done cash in Euro Currency for each month.

Pocket Money - € 180 per month (Payments will be done cash in Euro Currency each month).

Travel reimbursement

The travel costs will be reimbursed (with maximum cost of 309 Euro-580 Euro for) by the coordinator accompanied by the receipt of complete and original tickets, invoices, bills, boarding cards etc. The reimbursement will be done before the volunteer's departure.

The travel expenses reimbursement within the set limit is subject to providing travel documents as well as fulfilling the participation requirements. Make sure to keep invoices of all ticket purchases, online ticket pdfs and original tickets in case of buying train/bus tickets in the form of paper.

You will be reimbursed for your travel costs up to the given limit after you have completed the project and administrative duties. If you exceed the maximum limit, you pay the rest. The distance is calculated by official distance calculator:

Youthpass Certificate

All volunteers who have completed their ESC project are entitled to a certificate called a Youthpass signed by the Head of the Youth Agency. More details about the Youthpass Certificate:

This is a recognizable certificate that reflects the skills and competences they could develop due to their voluntary service. This certificate is generated from the system where we register the volunteer. One week before finishing the ESC, we will send the link to the volunteers and they will fill the 8 competences. After receiving the submission from the volunteer we will provide a printed copy of the certificate.

Time Schedule (will update if need)

The volunteers will work five days per week with a total of 35-40 working hours. Two days will be free-days. Additionally, each month the volunteers will have two extra

days off that they can use when they want to visit or plan something on their own. The volunteers will work in the office, at school, in local community and at local sports club organizing different activities.
