## ofensiva OUR MISSION IS

The mission of our association is to provide young people with accessible educational opportunities to help them reach their full potential. In this regard, educating young people in Arad to accept diversity and create a pleasant and safe environment for them is of particular interest to us.

In addition, as active members of the European Peer Training Organization, we are seeking to help fulfilling our common mission, to help young people embrace the diversity that surrounds us, but also to promote peer education as a way of social transformation.

#### **OUR MAIN OBJECTIVES ARE:**

- to foster an inclusive attitude among at least 500 local youngsters from the Arad county;
- to improve/increase the support that 200 youngsters from vulnerable groups receive (mainly youngsters with disability, from the Roma community, etc.);
- to promote solidarity with persons belonging to vulnerable groups among 24 youngsters from 6 countries through local and international volunteering activities;
- to promote solidarity with persons from vulnerable groups and is set to achieve this through local and international volunteering activities;
- to engage young people and local organisations to create and implement solidarity activities that promote social inclusion;
- to envision the implementation of high quality solidarity activities done in cooperation with relevant local stakeholders, by an experienced hosting organisation, in a partnership that has proven to be effective in other occasions, using good practices tested in other projects;
- to envision the use of quality non-formal learning and peereducation as main tools for social transformation.

#### 1.EDUCATION

Educating the youngsters to be more tolerant through specific training programmes. This will be achieved by organising weekly anti-discrimination and anti-bullying workshops in different secondary schools form Arad county, and other non-formal activities in partner schools with the aim of promoting European youth programs, the active participation of pupils in them and the stimulation of their own volunteering initiatives with vulnerable groups.





#### 2. INSPIRATION



Having the volunteers become role models for the young people they will be working with.

This will be achieved through educational theatre activities in kindergartens and schools, with the volunteers using educational drama to promotes values such as empathy, friendship, respect for diversity and solidarity among children.



Involving the volunteers and local youngsters in activities that are in favour of vulnerable groups. This will be achieved through involving the volunteers and local youngsters in activities with our partners working with our partners working with day centre and other similar institutions from Arad), organising activities (weekly game sessions with young people from privileged and disadvantaged neighbourhoods of the host community) and supporting the volunteers in developing own initiatives aimed at supporting persons and backgrounds are cared for.



#### **EUROPEAN SOLIDARITY CORPS**



THE POWER OF TOGETHER.

The European Solidarity Corps is the new European Union initiative which creates opportunities for young people to volunteer or work in projects in their own country or abroad that benefit communities and people around Europe.



Mission: to bring together young people to build a more inclusive society, supporting vulnerable people and responding to societal challenges. It offers an inspiring and empowering experience for young people who want to help, learn, and develop.

### **ACTIVITIES**

- Arad has a very high rate of exclusion (and consequently bullying). In the
  last three international volunteering projects we organised, through
  more than 2000 dedicated questionnaires applied at local level to
  youngsters aged 13 24, we discovered that:
- Intolerance reaches alarming levels (> 50%) when it comes to some vulnerable groups such as: persons of another religion, those belonging to the Roma minority, those with disabilities or with another sexual orientation;
- Over 60% of youngsters admit that they were involved in oppressing their peers;
- As little as 4% of youngsters with disabilities are participating in activities conducted by a youth organisation and close to 90% of the youth organisations do not provide accessible services to persons with disabilities.

TAKING INTO CONSIDERATION
THE PROBLEMS IDENTIFIED. THE
ACTIVITIES WE PROPOSE
INCLUDE:

- Anti-discrimination workshops in schools, with more than 2000 beneficiaries;
- Training activities for teachers in the field of inclusion and nonformal education, with over 20 schools involved;
- Training activities for youth workers and young volunteers, with more than 200 persons trained who multiplied the programme with more than 2500 young people;
- Volunteering activities in favor of vulnerable groups, with more than 100 young people involved.
- The intervention model we are proposing, based on the lessons learned in previous projects, includes a three-way approach:

# ACTIVITIES CURCUBEU CENTRE

- Curcubeu Center in Arad is a social service dedicated to children aged 6 to 12 from disadvantaged families, with the aim of preventing school dropout and the separation of children from their parents. The activities that the volunteers carry out in this center are varied, depending on what is required by the staff in charge.
- Volunteers host both non-formal education sessions—such as educational games—as well as outdoor games and activities.
   Sometimes, different events are organized around specific themes, like Children's Day, International Roma Day, or other annual celebrations.
- During these events, volunteers participate and offer support whenever needed. Activities at the center typically take place under the supervision of the staff, and volunteers are expected to prepare engaging sessions in advance. The topics for these activities are usually decided together with Ramona, the teacher from Curcubeu.



# ACTIVITIES VLADIMIRESCU CENTRE

- The Counseling and Support Center for Children and Adults in Vladimirescu commune, Arad county, is a social service under the City Hall, dedicated to supporting people in need.
- The Center provides psychological support, counseling and social assistance for children, families and adults, contributing to social integration and improving the quality of life of beneficiaries in the community. It is about 10 km from Arad, and volunteers usually go to this location using the tram or bus for which they have free transportation. Here at the center in Vladimirescu, they work with children aged between 8 and 12, but some of them with mild disabilities such as concentration problems or ADHD.
- The activities that volunteers carry out here range from nonformal education activities to English classes or even homework help. Usually, in the warm season, the activities are hosted in the courtyard, and most of them are educational games that the volunteers have to prepare for each session.



## **ACTIVITIES**

#### **WORKSHOPS IN SCHOOLS**

- The volunteers involved in this project organize educational and interactive workshops in schools and high schools in Arad County, adapted to the age of the students (8-18 years old) and the needs institution. The topics covered include of each discrimination, inclusion, environmental social protection, intercultural education and combating misinformation and fake news, and many more. These activities are designed by volunteers and are based on non-formal education methods that encourage active participation, critical thinking and free expression of ideas.
- Usually, the initiative to organize the workshops comes from schools and the topics are chosen according to students' interests or local events. The aim of these meetings is to support young people's personal and social development, to promote respect for diversity and responsibility towards the community and the environment in a safe and friendly space.



# ACTIVITIES LOGS -REFUGEE CENTRE

- LOGS (Social Initiatives Group) is an organization in Timisoara that supports vulnerable groups such as migrants and refugees.
   Founded in 2019, it offers services such as counseling, career guidance and social integration.
- LOGS also offers cultural adaptation courses for migrants and organizes projects promoting mental health and well-being. It actively assists refugees, including those from Ukraine, with humanitarian aid and support.
- Here, our volunteers go to provide help in the activities that LOGS
  carries out on a daily basis, whether it is non-formal education
  activities that take place in classrooms such as English classes or
  homework help, or outdoor activities, hikes, festivals and other
  events that they organize. Travel to this location is by train or bus,
  as it is about 50 km from Arad.



### **ACTIVITIES**

#### **BLIND PEOPLE ASSOCIATION**

- The National Association of the Blind in Romania Arad Branch (ANR Arad) is a non-profit organization that supports and represents individuals with visual impairments. In addition to advocacy, ANR Arad is actively involved in community life, organizing events such as Christmas celebrations for children and hosting national trainings focused on mental health for young people and individuals with disabilities.
- Volunteers regularly coordinate a variety of recreational, educational, and awareness-raising activities designed to foster inclusion and meaningful connections. These include multicultural cooking nights, interactive games, and arts and crafts sessions for both adults and their children, all in a welcoming and supportive environment. The organization also hosts workshops that promote awareness and understanding of visual impairments and disability rights. Special events such as tandem bike rides and creative projects—like building a model of the city of Arad—further encourage creativity, collaboration, and community involvement.






- · Between 18-30 years old;

- Being open to leave their comfort zone and integrate into a foreign country, different in terms of customs, traditions, mentality, culture etc;




THE STAGE PERIOD CAN BE 6 - 12 MONTHS

Arad is situated on the West part of Romania, 50 km far from Hungarian border, being the 13th biggest city of Romania, with around 200.000 citizens. In the past Arad was called "little Vienna" because the architecture from the center of the 2 cities were quite similar. The river that runs through the city is called

About Arad



- <u>Accommodation</u> you will be staying in rented apartments, 2
  persons/room (same gender), with access to bathroom (common),
  kitchen (common) and other utilities. The apartments will house
  individuals of all genders.
- Meal you will receive a monthly food allowance so you can arrange your own meals.
- <u>Local Transportation</u> you will receive a monthly tram ticket valid on all tram lines.
- Internet you will have access to internet at the accommodation and work place.
- Washing machine and refrigerator will be found in each apartment.
- When you arrive in Arad, you will be provided with a romanian SIM card (phone number) with credit so you can call and use internet. After 30 days you will have to charge it by yourself.
- You will have <u>a facilitator</u> who will help you with everything concerning the activities (schedule, materials, taking you to activity places etc).
- You will have <u>a mentor</u> with whom you will discuss about your personal life, leisure activities and other problems or situations you might face during your ESC experience.
- You will have <u>a Romanian teacher</u> with whom you will meet every week. The Romanian language classes are mandatory.
- You will need to keep all travel documents and bring them in original to our organization (flight ticket, flight itinerary, boarding pass, invoice for transfer etc)
- <u>Visa costs</u> the project covers for the visa costs if you need one to come to Romania.



Take whatever you consider necessary for your stay.


Keep in mind winters here can be very cold and summers extremely hot.

Your destination is the city of ARAD and you have several possibilities to get here:

#### **1.TIMIȘOARA AIRPORT**

- Situated 40 km from Arad;
- In case you arrive here, a member of the association will be in the airport waiting for you and will take you to your accommodation place.

#### 2.BUDAPEST AIRPORT

- Situated 260 km from Arad;
- Use the train; there are direct routes from Budapest several times each day, from the Keleti train station. The journey takes around 4-5 hours to Arad; here you can find the website for purchasing the tickets online and, on the next page, there is also an example of schedule:
