Our training is based entirely on non-formal education with a specific focus on outdoor learning and experiential methods. You'll discover and practice a variety of engaging approaches:

- Outdoor education techniques
- Experiential learning activities

- Team-building exercises
- · Simulations and role-plays
- Educational escape games
- Board and trivia games

You'll not only learn new methods but also have the opportunity to create your own approaches and test them with peers from other countries. You will have the opportunity to develop an escape room for local youth in the Urlati community.
