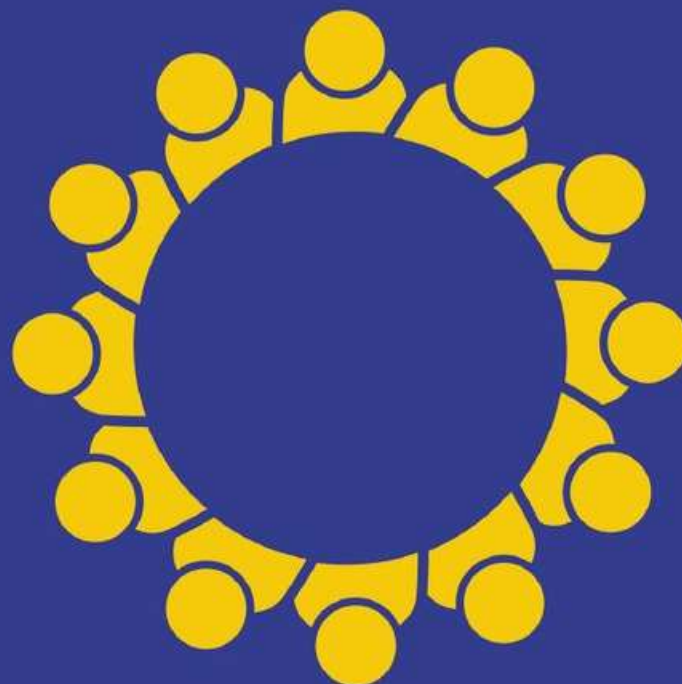

About the project

"Participation Matters!" is a project conceived, created and aimed at young people, who will also be the protagonists of all the activities. It responds to their needs to identify the benefits of being part of the EU, to know how its institutions work, to know the tools available to citizens to get in touch with its institutions and to make their voices heard. The project aims to provide young people with useful information and tools to be protagonists of decision-making processes, becoming a factor for the improvement of European societies. The project also aims to improve activities in the field of non-formal education and strengthen relations between partner associations, strengthening their development path that they have undertaken at local, national and international level. The project also aims to meet young people's needs for youth participation by informing them about the programmes offered by the EU and aimed at them. The project provides that the participants, coming from Italy, Greece, Poland, Romania, Bulgaria, Lithuania and Spain, will carry out local activities that will be preparatory and interspersed with 3 international mobility in Greece, Poland and Italy. Locally, participants will ask their peers what are the most important issues that the EU should address. During the mobilities, the responses will be combined to identify the priority topic, based on the EU Youth Goals. Then, they will analyse the tools citizens have to submit their requests to the EU. Finally, they will converge towards a European Citizens' Initiative to be proposed on the basis of the topic identified. Participants will also be able to engage with local policy makers and heads of the offices of EU bodies. We expect that the project will convert participants into local EU "ambassadors", able to properly inform their peers and give them the right information regarding EU programmes and projects.

Participants

All participants **MUST** bring the European Health Insurance Card or a private health insurance. It is strongly advised for participants to hold travel insurance covering them for the whole duration of the activity.

Number of participants:

The project expects to host 28 participants belonging to 6 partner organisations plus ETV EuroTreviso, for a period of **3 days in Treviso, Italy**.

Each organisation will select **4 participants** between **18-30 years old**.

The travel days are: **Tuesday, 18/11/2025** and **Saturday, 22/11/2025**. You have 1 extra day before and/or after, but you will have to cover your own expenses.

Financial Conditions

This activity is financed by the Erasmus+ Youth program of the European Union and it is supported by ETV EuroTreviso.

Travel costs and accommodation are covered **100%** by the program.

Participants must leave from and return to the country of origin of the organisation to which they belong.

We will cover your travel costs, according to the European Commission travel reimbursement, to a maximum per country of:

- **Bulgaria, Greece, Lithuania, Poland, Romania, Spain:** 309€ / person round trip.

(If paid expenses for your travel are less than this amount, you will be reimbursed only up to the total amount of your travel tickets)

Therefore, if you cannot provide your original ticket, receipts, insurance and invoices clearly stating the travel agency, your name and the exact costs of the tickets, we will not be able to reimburse you.

- **Keep all** the receipts with prices (bus tickets, train tickets, electronic flight ticket, travel agency reservations, etc.).
- **Keep all** your flight boarding passes (outward and return).

Please **DO NOT BUY any tickets** before the final approval of ETV EuroTreviso!



How to get to Treviso?

From Venice Airport "Marco Polo" -

Treviso has two International airports nearby, but this one from Venice is the second one closest to Treviso. The distance between Treviso and Venice is about 30 km.

Bus + Train:

- **ACTV** bus line 15 or **ATVO** "Venice Marco Polo Airport - Mestre railway station (Fly Bus - express service)" to train station of **VENEZIA MESTRE** and then train to **Treviso Centrale** or **Udine** or **Calalzo** or **Conegliano** or **Trieste** (via Udine).

From Treviso Airport ("Canova") - <https://www.trevisoairport.it/en/> This is the nearest airport. From the airport you can take the MOM (bus) urban line **number 6** to the **Treviso Train Station** that is almost in the city centre. The bus ticket costs €2,00 at the ticket office (in the Arrivals hall on the ground floor of Treviso Airport terminal building). You can also buy the ticket on the bus, but it will cost €4,00. Accommodation venue



Participants will stay in **4x5-people flats + 1x4-people flat** in the same building located in the city centre. Participants will share the bedrooms and the bathrooms.

It is likely that you will have to sleep in a double bed (or double sofa bed) together with another participant of the same gender. Please, keep this in mind before applying.

2x5-people flats have each:

- 1 bedroom with 1 double bed for 2 people;
- 1 bedroom with 1 single bed for 1 person;
- 1 double sofa bed in the living room for 2 people;
- bed linen;
- kitchenette equipped with fridge, coffee machine, microwave and complete dinnerware set;
- 2 bathrooms with toilet, shower and towels.

1x5-people flats has:

- 1 bedroom with 1 double bed for 2 people;
- 1 bedroom with 1 single bed for 1 person;
- 1 double sofa bed in the living room for 2 people;
- bed linen;

The flats are equipped with TV and Wi-fi.

Important! Waste management: Treviso has adopted a high standard of waste recycling policy, so there's a curbside collection for each type of waste. You have a calendar (available also as an app for iPhone & Android) with the days when **YELLOW** bins (paper), **BLUE** bins (glass, plastic and cans), **BROWN** (organic) and **GREY** (residual non-recyclable waste) will be collected. Please put the bins just out of the door by the street the evening before!

Meals

According to the budget limit full board (breakfast, lunch and dinner) will be covered by the project grant. ETV EuroTreviso will provide everything you need for breakfast and dinner in the flats. The lunch will be in a restaurant with a fixed menu. Possible changes regarding the meals will be communicated in the welcome meeting during the first day.



About Treviso



Treviso is a city and comune in the Veneto region of northern Italy. It is the capital of the province of Treviso and the municipality has 85,492 inhabitants (as of July 2024). The city is home to the headquarters of clothing retailer Benetton, Sisley, Geox, Diadora, appliance maker De'Longhi, and bicycle maker Pinarello. Treviso is also known for being the original production area of Prosecco wine and radicchio, and being one of several towns thought to have been the origin of the popular Italian dessert tiramisù. Treviso stands at the confluence of Botteniga with the Sile, 30 kilometres north of Venice, 50 km east of Vicenza and 40 km north-east of Padua. The city is situated 15 km south-west of the right bank of the Piave River, on the plain between the Gulf of Venice and the Alps.



The origins of Treviso stretch way back into the past. The remains of an ancient village found along the Sile river place the origins of the city in the Bronze Age (15th century BC). In 49 BC, Treviso, formerly known as Tarvisium received the town charter and flourished under Roman rule. In 396 AD, the city was elevated to the status of bishopric. Under the Goths and Carolingians, Treviso continued to flourish and became the capital of the whole region. In 1164 the Emperor Frederick I recognized the city as a free commune. Thus began its most glorious period, Treviso extended its domain, adorned itself with

new churches and buildings and hosted poets and artists. Despite continuing prosperity, Treviso was unable to assert its power against the aggressive neighbouring cities. In 1339, the city was conquered for the first time by the Republic of Venice but the population of Treviso decided to join the republic of Venice definitively in 1389 leading to a long and prosperous time of peace for the city. Treviso became filled with buildings and frescoes in Venetian Gothic style. In 1509 Venice decided to give the city new fortifications to be able to defend its territories to the north. In 1797 the Austrians assumed power in the province of Treviso and ruled the city with short French interruptions until 1866, when it became part of Italy. During the First and Second World War the city was the target of bombing raids, which damaged or destroyed part of the historic buildings, but thanks to excellent reconstruction and restoration works the city centre still has an untouched appeal.

Weather

Climate in this area has mild differences between highs and lows, and there is adequate rainfall year-round. 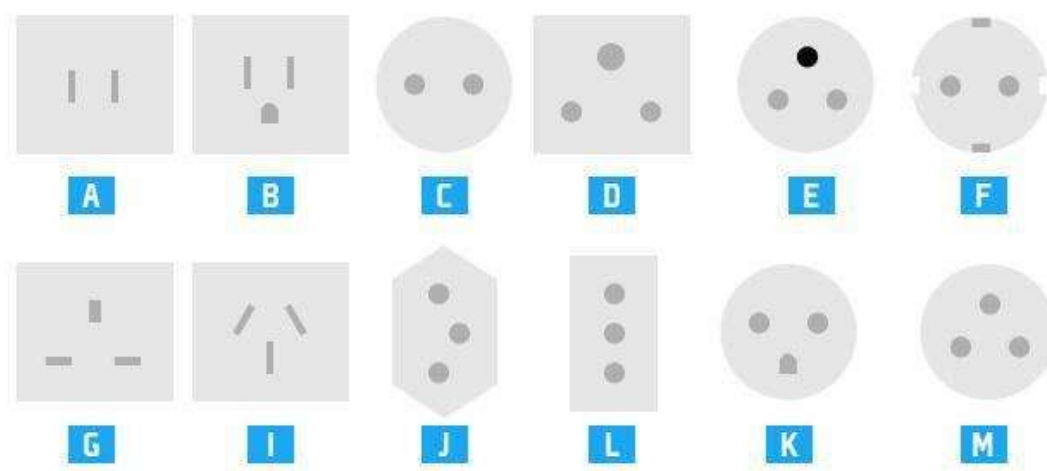

We recommend you bring comfortable clothes and shoes (and a photo camera if you have one) for walking around this beautiful city in your free time.

Tips and useful Information

- ★ **Currency in Italy:** euro (EUR)
- ★ **Type of power sockets:** C, L (most common) and F. The standard voltage is 230 V and the standard frequency is 50 Hz.





- ★ **Allergies:** It would be very helpful to know if any of you is allergic to any kind of food or drink as well as any other allergy or important illness that we should be aware of.
- ★ **ID or Passport:** If you have both ID and passport, we recommend you to bring both. It would be a good idea to always bring one at home and take the other with you. If you only have one of these documents, don't worry, it is enough with one of them. In this case we recommend you to make a photocopy and once that you are in Treviso, always bring with you the photocopy for daily use and leave the original safe at home. Also, although Treviso is a very safe city, it is a city after all, but in any case we recommend you not to bring daily with you big amounts of money in cash, but only approximately the amount that you need for daily use.
- ★ **Student card:** if you have some student card (i.e. ISIC), you can also bring it as you can obtain some discounts at the entrance to some monuments!

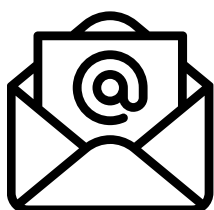
