PARTICIPANTS PROFILE

Our project will include 35 participants from five different countries.

- The participants will be evenly divided into two groups:
 - People with prostheses: 20 participants
 - o People without any disabilities:15 participants
- Gender Distribution
 - Women: 18 participants
 - Men: 17 participants

Selection Criteria:

- People with prostheses: Participants with various types of prosthetic limbs.
- People without disabilities: Participants with no physical disabilities.
- Age Range: The participants will be between the ages of 18 and 30.
- Diverse Backgrounds: Participants will come from different cultural and socio-economic backgrounds to ensure diversity.
- Interest in the Project Theme: Participants must demonstrate a keen interest in the project's objectives and a willingness to engage in all planned activities.
- Every partner should choose 8 participants.
- Deadline is 27 September.





DAY-BY-DAY OVERVIEW

- **Day 1**: Morning sports and icebreaker games to learn names, origins, and ages, followed by a theoretical session on disability stages, effects, and prosthetic construction, guided by experts. The day ends with a local excursion and an evaluation session.
- Day 2: Teams will be formed for a culturally diverse match to encourage dialogue and connections. Winners will receive small prizes.
- **Day 3**: Visits to a hospital to meet others with physical disabilities and a university to meet students studying biomechanics.
- **Day 4:** Participants will engage in an active start followed by the 'My Story' session where they share personal experiences with disabilities and answer questions.
- **Day 5:** An outdoor activity focused on environmental sensitivity and teamwork, concluding with a match and prizes.
- **Day 6:** Focus on Erasmus+ information, creating a visible information corner, preparing brochures, and increasing project visibility with a large canvas. The day ends with youthpass certificate distribution.
- **Day 7**: Final evaluations and a mini sketch activity where groups from different nationalities perform short plays about life with disabilities, fostering cultural exchange and teamwork.
