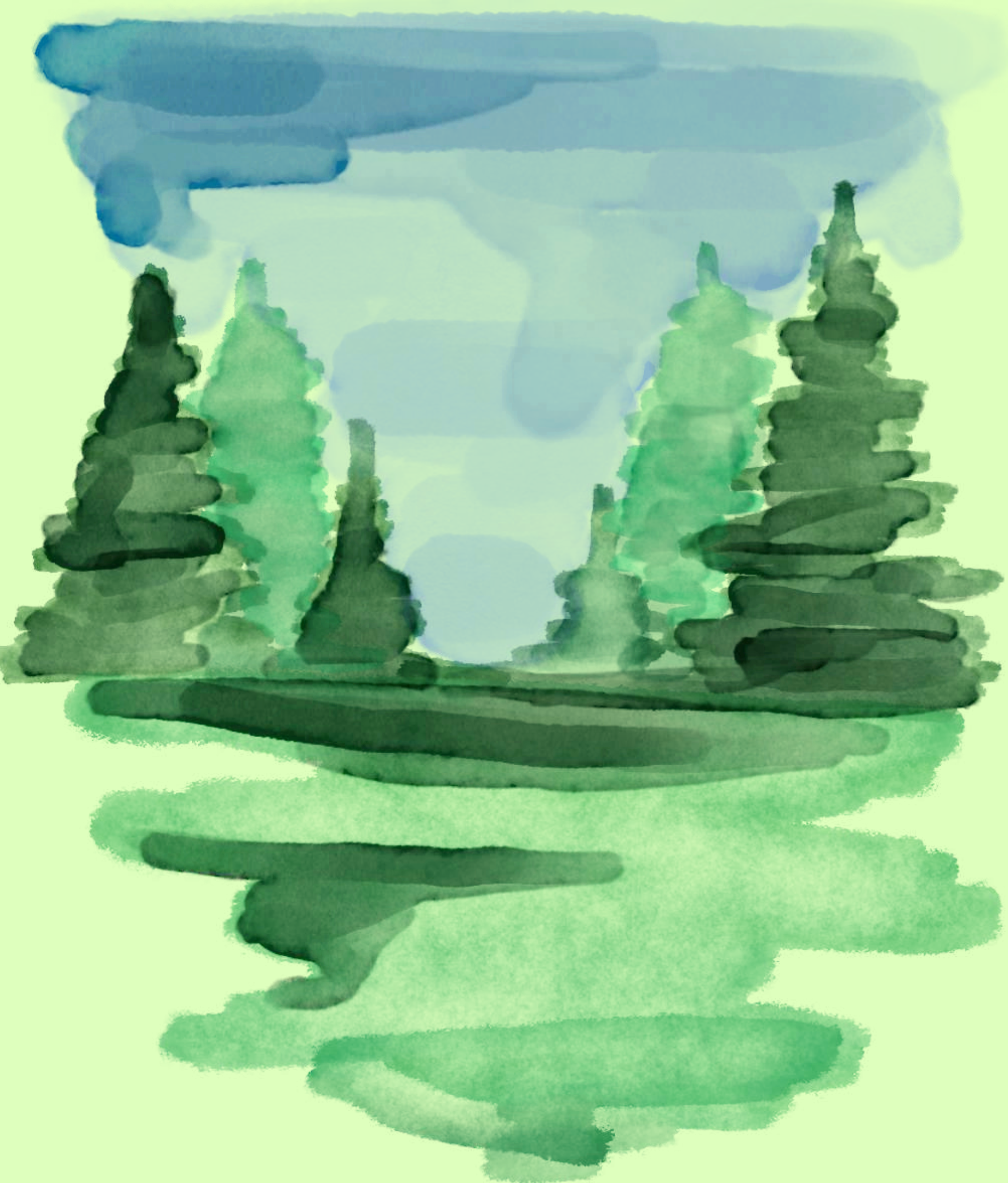

Description



Art for (H)Eart(h) is a youth participation project focused on nature conservation, artistic expression, and civic engagement. The project encourages young people to build a deeper connection with nature and to transform their experiences into artistic outputs that raise awareness in their local communities.

Through study visits, reflection, workshops, and shared creative processes, participants will explore environmental protection in a practical and meaningful way. The project aims to inspire both participants and the wider community to take action for a more sustainable future.

Why this project matters?

RECONNECT WITH NATURE

Young people often feel disconnected from the environment. This project helps rebuild that connection through direct experience, observation, and reflection.

CREATE THROUGH ART

Participants transform what they learn into artistic expression, using creativity to communicate emotions, values, and messages connected to nature conservation.

RAISE AWARENESS

The project aims to inspire local communities and encourage more active care for the environment through youth-led artistic outputs and public visibility.



How will it work?

NON FORMAL LEARNING

Learning by doing, sharing, reflecting, and creating together.

NATURE-BASED EXPERIENCE

Activities are rooted in contact with places, people, and stories linked to environmental protection.

ARTISTIC EXPRESSION

Participants will use art and creativity to express ideas, emotions, and messages connected to nature conservation.

PARTICIPATION

Young people are active contributors, not passive attendees.

Reimbursement

Tickets & documents

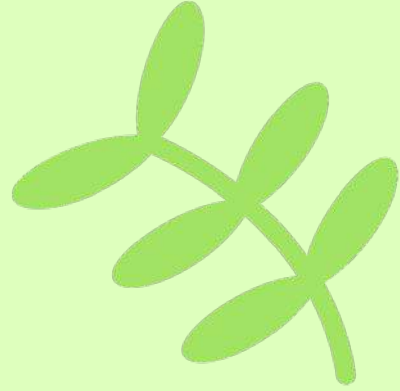

Travel tips



PRIMARY AIRPORT

- Vilnius Airport (VNO) – the main international airport serving Vilnius and the surrounding region. It is the closest airport to Meda House – only 15 min from central Vilnius and a short ride further to your destination.
- Kaunas Airport (KUN) – 100 km away; reachable by bus/train to Vilnius then onward transport.

FROM VILNIUS AIRPORT TO YOUR FINAL DESTINATION

- Taxi: Official airport taxi stands are right outside the arrivals hall – good if you have luggage. Expect 10–30€ to get near Vilnius.
- Bolt/Uber: Typically cheaper than taxis and reliable – book via app and be picked up at the designated zone by the airport exit.
- Bus from Airport to Vilnius city centre: Buses like 88, 3G, 1, 2 connect the airport with central stops in 20–25 min. Tickets are often under 2€.
- Train to Vilnius Railway Station: About 8–10 min ride; then change to local transport or transfer.

Public buses won't take you directly to Meda House – you'd need a combination of buses/ride-hail once in Vilnius

You can book a car directly to drop you right at Meda House's address.





What to Prepare


BEFORE TRAVELLING

- Wait for confirmation from the organisers before booking travel.
- Stay in touch with your sending organisation.
- Keep administrative and travel documents.

PRACTICAL READINESS

- Bring a valid travel document (Passport/ID Card), your EHIC (or equivalent insurance) card and any required personal items.

FOR THE PROGRAM

- Prepare for artistic, reflective, and group-based activities.
 - Be ready to share ideas, perspectives, and experiences with an international group.
